


1. The PRESENTATION of the Rapture


- The *rapture* refers to the sudden catching up of church age believers to meet the Lord in the air when He returns at the close of the present age.
- The rapture, like the church age, is a mystery (1 Cor. 15:51).

- B. The rapture provides certain blessings for the body of Christ.

Special Blessings for the Church

- Glorified bodies (1 Cor. 15:51; Rom. 8:23-25)
- Meet the Lord (1 Thess. 4:17)
- Reunion with loved ones (1 Thess. 4:17)
- Rewards (Rev. 22:12)
- Marriage of the Lamb (Rev. 19:6-8)

2. The PURPOSE of the rapture

- A. The rapture brings an end to the church age.
- B. The rapture provides certain blessings for the body of Christ.
- C. The rapture rescues the church from the wrath to come.
 - 1 Thess. 1:10
 - 1 Thess. 5:9
 - Rev. 3:10

3. The PORTRAYAL of the rapture

- 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18
 - The certainty of the rapture is connected to the historical reality of Jesus' resurrection (v. 14).
 - The Lord will return during the earthly lives of some believers (v. 15).
 - Jesus Himself will descend with a shout, the voice of an archangel, and the trumpet of God (v. 16).


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
- The bodies of dead believers will be resurrected and glorified (v. 16).
- Living believers will be translated into their glorified bodies in the twinkling of an eye (1 Cor. 15:51-52).
- Translated believers will be caught up to meet the Lord in the air (v. 17).
- Our eternity with Christ begins (v. 17)!

Five Proofs of Pretribulationism

- 1. The church will be rescued *before* the Day of the Lord's wrath.
 - 1 Thess. 1:10; 5:9; Rev. 3:10
 - The Day of the Lord's wrath encompasses the entire 70th week of Daniel (Zeph. 1:14-18; Hos. 5:10; Ez. 7:19; Luke 21:23).

Day of the Lord's Wrath

- The seal judgments of Revelation 6 comprise the prophetic wrath of God.
 - Rev. 4-5 is a theodicy which demonstrates that the Lamb is worthy and justified to open the seals.
 - Opening the seals = unleashing the wrath of God.
 - For the first four seals the four living creatures are announcing the source of the wrath.

Day of the Lord's Wrath

- Rev. 6:8 quotes Ezekiel 14:21. The Ezekiel context is clearly wrath.
- In Rev. 6:16-17 the people are already hiding from the wrath of God.
- Thus, <u>the seal judgments = the</u> <u>prophetic wrath of God.</u>

Day of the Lord's Wrath

- The seal judgments of Revelation 6 begin at the start of the seven-year Tribulation.
 - The first seal is the unveiling of the antichrist. This must occur at the beginning of the Tribulation according to Daniel 9:27.
 - The Olivet Discourse gives a chronological account of the entire 70th week of Daniel (note time words; cf. Matt. 24:15).

Day of the Lord's Wrath

A comparison of the seals with the Olivet Discourse in Matthew 24 indicates that the seals take place at the start of the 70th week.

Day of the Lord's Wrath

- Conclusion:
 - Since the seals = the prophetic "Day of the Lord's wrath,"
 - And since the seals begin at the start of the 70th week of Daniel;
 - The "Day of the Lord's wrath" *must begin* at the start of Daniel's 70th week.
 - And since the church is rescued from (kept out of) the Day of the Lord's wrath, <u>the</u> <u>church must be raptured before the</u> <u>tribulation</u>.


Jewish Nature of the Tribulation

- "Jacob's trouble" (Jer. 30:7)
- "your people" and "your holy city" (Dan. 9:24)
- 144,000 (Rev. 7)
- Olivet Discourse (Matt. 24-25)
- OT descriptions of this period (e.g. Zech. 12:8-9)

Five Proofs of Pretribulationism

- 1. The church will be rescued *before* the Day of the Lord's wrath.
 - 1 Thess. 1:10; 5:9; Rev. 3:10
- 2. The nature of the tribulation is totally Jewish.
- 3. The literary structure of the book of Revelation indicates that the church is not present once the seals begin.

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Five Proofs of Pretribulationism

- 5. 2 Thessalonians 2:1-10 explicitly demands a pretribulation rapture.
 - The issue at hand is: "Are we in the Day of the Lord or not?"
 - Paul assures them that the day of the Lord is not here because the "departure" has not happened and the "man of sin" has not been unveiled (v. 3).

Five Proofs of Pretribulationism

- Furthermore, the "restrainer" must be taken out of the way (v. 7)
- The conclusion is that the departure of the church to meet the Lord in the air (i.e. the rapture) must precede the arrival of the Day of the Lord's wrath.

A Note about Imminency

- There are several passages that imply the imminent return of the Lord for his bride.
 - 1 Cor. 15:51-52; Phil. 3:20; 4:5; Titus 2:13; James 5:7-9; 1 John 2:28; Rev. 3:11; 22:7, 12, 17, 20.
- Notice that this list *does not* include "watchful language" passages (e.g 1 Thess. 5:2) because that terminology is also used to refer to the second coming, which is *not* imminent (eg. Matt. 24:42; Rev. 16:15).

A Note about Imminency

 In other words, an exhortation to "watch" for the Lord's return is not necessarily an explicit indication of the imminency of the rapture since believers during the tribulation are likewise exhorted to "watch," and the second coming is obviously not imminent.

A Note about Imminency

- Imminency is not a primary exegetical proof of pretribulationism.
- Rather, imminency is derived from theological conclusions regarding the order of end times events.
- That is, imminency does not prove pretribulationism; pretribulationism demands imminency.

5. The PROVOCATION of the rapture

- A. Do not be troubled. (John 14:1; cf. 2 Thess. 2:2)
- B. Comfort one another. (1 Thess. 4:18)
- C. Do not be concerned with the date of the rapture. (1 Thes. 5:1)
- D. Be steadfast, immovable and abounding in the work of the Lord. (1 Cor. 15:58)

To Whom It May Concern

The believers of this household are looking for the imminent return of the Lord Jesus Christ. When it occurs, it will suddenly be discovered that thousands of people are missing and this home will be found empty. Then may you realize that the true Christian Church has been taken out of this world, an event of which the Apostle Paul wrote so clearly in 1 Thess. 4:13-18 and 1 Cor. 15:50-58. It will mean that Christ has called His people, those who are saved by grace through faith in Him to "ever be with the Lord."

Do not search for us. We will return with Christ after seven years of tribulation (spoken of in Revelation chapters 6-18) when He comes to judge the antichrist and to take the throne of His father, David, as promised Him. In the meantime, do not weep for us. For we are finally home!

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Challenge

- 1. Remain in close fellowship with Christ so that we are not ashamed when He comes (1 John 2:28).
- 2. Live our lives in such a way that we will be rewarded at the Judgment Seat of Christ (1 Cor. 3:10-15; 2 Cor. 5:9-11; Col. 3:23-24; 2 John 8; Rev. 22:12).
- 3. Redeem the time because there is no guarantee of tomorrow (cf. James 4:14; Eph. 5:15-16).

Challenge

- 4. Anticipate and be comforted by the prospect of being reunited with believers who have died (1 Thess. 4:13-18).
- 5. Allow the prospect of the rapture to give you hope during difficult times (Col. 1:27; Titus 2:13).
