1.	In Peter's conclusion to his evangelistic message to this Jewish crowd (vv. 14b-35), he now called for personal application
	a. They needed to "know assuredly" (imper.) that they were personally accountable for Jesus (v. 36a)
	b. They needed to "know assuredly" that Jesus was/remains (v. 36b)
	c. They needed to "know assuredly" that Jesus was/remains the (v. 36c)
2.	Peter's audience was "cut to the heart", i.e., they were of their
	of putting this innocent man to death. (v. 37a)
	* Does conviction of a particular sin always mean someone has automatically believed the Gospel?
3.	In response, these unsaved Jews then asked Peter and the other apostles a very good question, "Men and brethren, shall ?" (v. 37b)
	* How is this question similar and yet different from Acts 16:30?
	* Were these people saved at this point?

4.	In v. 38, Peter answered their question by simply telling them to (change their minds) and be, just as Jesus had instructed in the Great Commission just days before. (v. 38a, cf. Matt. 28:18-20; Mark 16:15-16; Luke 24:46-48)
	* Was Peter telling them that water baptism was necessary "for the remission of sins"? (Luke 24:46; Acts 3:19; 5:31; 10:43; 13:38-39; 26:17-18)
5.	Peter was teaching that every one of them needed to repent and (GK epi) "the of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins" (v. 38b, cf. Acts 2:21; 9:42; 11:17; 16:31; 22:19)
6.	In the context of this entire sermon, Peter had already declared that
	a. Jesus was who He claimed to be by performing and (v. 22)
	b. God Jesus to be crucified and put to (v. 23)
	c. The Lord Jesus from the (v. 24)
	d. Jesus was both and the (v. 36)
7.	The apostle promised that if they repented and rested upon the name of Christ, they would " the of the Holy Spirit," just like they did. (v. 38c-40)
8.	The wonderful, miraculous response by this enormous crowd was that people on Christ for salvation, and were water baptized as a public testimony. (v. 41)
	* What can you personally learn from Peter's evangelistic example today?
