## A MIRACLE TO CONFIRM THE MESSAGE OF THE MESSIAH (Acts 3:1-11)

## I. THE INFANCY AND THE GROWTH OF THE CHURCH IN JERUSALEM (3-7)

## A. A Miracle Performed in the Name of Jesus Christ (3:1-11)

- 1. These Jewish believers were still \_\_\_\_\_\_ to the temple and to the \_\_\_\_\_\_ hours of prayer: morning (9:00 A.M.), afternoon (3:00 P.M.), and evening (sunset); Peter and John went to the temple to pray at \_\_\_\_\_\_ in the afternoon. (v. 1)
