2.	Sto	ephen responded to the charges of blasphemy against Moses. (vv. 17-37)
	a.	He demonstrated in further testimony from the Scriptures that while Israel was enslaved in Egypt, the Lord and up a deliverer at the appointed time, Moses who was "well pleasing to God."

	b.	Stephen explained that Moses was raised and educated by the; and when he tried to help Israelites they said: "Who made you a and a over us?"
	c.	The revered patriarch Moses predicted the coming of as a prophet like himself and said: "Him you shall hear.". (v. 37, cf. Acts 3:20-23; Deut. 18:15)

3.	Ste	ephen responded to the charges of blasphemy against the Law. (vv. 38-43)
	a.	Even though Moses did great " and in the land of Egypt, and in the Red Sea" (v. 36), Stephen explained "our fathers would obey, but rejected" him. (v. 39)
	b.	While Moses was receiving the Law from Jehovah on Mt. Sinai, Israel decided to break the Law before they received it; and a golden calf that had made.

	a.	Israel worshipped God via the for 500 years before the was built by Solomon.
	b.	Even the Old Testament itself teaches that Jehovah be in a temple building. (I Kings 8:27; Isa. 66:1)
5.		ephen's indictment against the religious leaders for their rejection of their Messiah (vv53)
	a.	Stephen charged them with being, just like their forefathers who had killed the prophets; only they had done they had killed their own Jewish Messiah!
	b.	These religious leaders demonstrated that they had for Moses nor the Law (Gen. 49:10); or they never would have the One Moses promised (Deut. 18:15).
