3.	Before entering Damascus, the, Christ personally appeared to Saul and he interacted with Jesus. (vv. 3-4, cf. 9:17, 27; 22:14; 26:16; 1 Cor. 9:1; 15:8)
	* What does the question "Why are you persecuting Me?" tell us about Christ and His Church? (1 Cor. 12; Eph. 4:12-16; Col. 1:18; 2:11-12, 19)
4.	Jesus revealed His identity to Saul (v. 5), and at this pivotal moment, while trembling he realized the of the he had been rejecting up to this point and asked, ", what do You want me to do?" (v. 6, cf. 26:16-18; Gal. 1:11-12)
