Α.	God's Servant Despised (53:1-3)				
	1.	Christ entered the world as a "tender plant," as a, not a king; He was born in a, not a palace, but He was the offspring of King David. (v. 2a, cf., 11:1; Rev. 22:16)

	2.	There was in Jesus' appearance that was unusually attractive that would naturally draw people to Him; in other words, most people give Him a look. (v. 2b)			
	3.	The revelation of "the Arm of the Lord" (v. 1) that would deliver the Lord's people was met with astonishment,, dismissal, and by His own people. (v. 3)			
В.	3. God's Servant Wounded (53:4-6)				
	1.	What the Servant did He did: the emphatic pronoun "He" Him from us; the "griefs" and "sorrows" was originally ours, but He took them Himself. (v. 4)			
	2.	Substitution is emphasized, He was wounded not for His own "transgressions," but, He was "bruised" not for His own iniquities, but (v. 5a)			
	3.	Jesus was in our so that we could have "peace" with God; by "His stripes" (His shed blood), believers would experience God's of spiritual healing. (v. 5b)			
	4.	Sheep are notoriously limited in perception and extremely self-centered, their only thought is how they can satisfy In contrast, God's Servant took our iniquity upon Himself. (v. 6)			

C.	Go	od's Servant Dies (53:7-9)		
	1.	At His three religious trials and three civil trials Messiah did His own defense. (v. 7)		
	2.	Christ "was cut off from the land of the living;" He was for the sins of (v. 8)		
	3.	Jesus was supposed to be buried with the rest of the criminals (John 19:31), but because He was innocent, God and had His Son buried in a tomb (v. 9, cf., Matt. 27:57-60).		
D.	O. God's Servant Resurrected and Triumphant (53:10-12)			
	1.	While the Jews and the Romans were certainly involved in the crucifixion of Messiah, it was who ultimately His own Son in order to "make His soul an offering for sin." (v. 10a)		
	2.	Verse 10b does not make any sense with a man in view, but One who has been anew to glorious power shall indeed "prosper in His hand." (v. 10b)		
	3.	God the Father saw His Son's death ("His soul") and His death as the full payment to justify those who would believe in Him. (v. 11)		
	4.	Because Jesus "poured out His soul to death" His Father would highly Him and give Him the name which is every name. (v. 12, cf. Philip. 2:9-11; Col. 2:9-10)
