1.	Verse 16 is transitional, to those believers who might attribute evil and temptation to God, the should "not be" (pres/pass/imper), a verb which describes being (1 Cor. 15:33; Gal. 6:7; and 1 John 3:7)
2.	There was the tendency to believe that God didn't care, but James defended the Lord to those who doubted His or (v. 16)
3.	Once you start to God's goodness, you will be to Satan's offers; and the natural desires within will reach out for his bait.
	The good and perfect of God (v. 17a) are starkly contrasted with the that springs from lust (v. 15).
2.	These good things habitually come down from our and the of the sun, moon and stars. (v. 17b, cf. Ps. 8:3; 135:7; 136:7-9; Jer. 4:23; 31:35; Amos 5:8; 1 John 1:5)

3.	Every created thing must undergo, for this is its property (2 <sup>nd</sup> law of thermal dynamics), but God is, with Him "there is no variation or shadow of turning". (v. 17c, cf. Mal. 3:6; Heb. 13:8)
	* How can this truth comfort you when going through testings and temptations?
4.	James gives an excellent example of God's good and perfect gifts, in that the Lord "brought us forth" i.e., from hell to heaven by His matchless grace. (v. 18a, cf. John 1:13; 3:3)
5.	The means that the Lord used for your new birth was "the word of truth" and this is a reference to the of (v. 18b, cf. Eph. 1:13; Col. 1:5)
6.	God had a in saving you, because you share the nature of God and are "a kind of firstfruits of His creatures" – a higher means a higher  (v. 18c, cf. 1 Cor. 15:20-23)
7.	Because you are a child of God you can in Christ on a daily basis and bring forth of that are pleasing in His sight. (John 15:1-5; 2 Cor. 9:9-11; Phil. 1:10-11)
