6.	Job complain bitterly against God for His treatment of him, but yet even though he didn't understand what was happening to him, he never his in the Lord. (Job 1:21; 2:10; 13:15; 16:19-21; 19:25-27)
7.	In spite of Job's complaining, God was "compassionate and merciful", and extremely, and at the end of his trial. (v. 11b, cf. Job 42:10-13)
