		* What should this tell you about Christ's concern regarding your own personal trials?						
	4.	For Jesus to stop the funeral procession by the stretcher of the dead man wa highly unusual to say the least; He did not fear becoming ceremonially (v. 14a)						
	5.	Christ (the sovereign of the universe) gave the dead corpse a, and the boy wa raised to and health. (v. 14b)						
		* What were two tell tale signs that the man was now truly alive? (v. 15)						
	6.	This was the first person raised from the dead by Jesus, and the response from those who witnessed it was a mixture of and God. (vv. 16-17)
