## F. THE SPIRITUAL DEATH OF CHRIST (Luke 23:44-45; Matt. 27:45-49; Mark 15:33-36)

1. After experiencing three hours of excruciating physical \_\_\_\_\_\_ and agony (Ps. 22:6-8, 11-19; 69:20-21), an eerie "darkness" fell on the earth at \_\_\_\_\_ (Jerusalem time) until \_\_\_\_\_ pm. (v. 44)

2. When God made His Son an offering for sin and poured out His wrath on Him, He supernaturally <u>His</u> from the eyes of the spectators; this was not an eclipse. (vv. 44-45, cf. Matt. 27:45; Mark 15:33; 2 Cor. 5:21)

3. In the other Synoptics, it is during this period of darkness that Jesus cried out, "*My God, My God, why have You* \_\_\_\_\_\_ *Me?*" (Matt. 27:45-49; Mark 15:33-36), and Psalm 22:1 informs us that He was \_\_\_\_\_\_ all \_\_\_\_\_ in this darkness.

4. Due to God's judicial and relational act of judgment (not a metaphysical or spatial separation in the Trinity), Jesus was \_\_\_\_\_\_ by God on the cross, and He \_\_\_\_\_\_ died. (Isa. 53:10-12; Heb. 5:7-8; 1 Pet. 3:18)

## G. THE PHYSICAL DEATH OF CHRIST (Luke 23:46-49; Matt. 27:50-56; Mark 15:37-41; John 19:28-30)

- 1. In Luke's narrative he moved the tearing of the temple veil up, whereas Matthew and Mark have it taking place at the very moment Christ voluntarily gave up His spirit.
  - a. In Luke the darkness and tearing of the veil most likely represented \_\_\_\_\_\_\_. (v. 45)
  - b. In Matthew and Mark's these events emphasized the \_\_\_\_\_\_ of the Mosaic Law, and the \_\_\_\_\_\_ of a new way to God through Christ. (Matt. 27:50-53; Mark 15:37-39)
- One thing that is very clear in all four Gospel accounts is that Jesus \_\_\_\_\_\_ gave up His \_\_\_\_\_\_ spirit, no one took it from Him. (v. 46, cf. Matt. 27:50; Mark 15:37; John 19:30)
- 3. Dr. Luke gives us three examples of the spectators' reactions to the death of Jesus Christ...
  - a. The *"centurion"* who was in charge of these crucifixions had presumably witnessed many, but he was thoroughly \_\_\_\_\_\_ by the darkness, the earthquake (Matt. 27:54), and the \_\_\_\_\_\_ in which Jesus died. (v. 47)
