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1.	A God given burden should lead you to pray for the Lord's wisdom and in the matter; despite being a man of action, Nehemiah's very first act
	was and (vv. 4-11; Prov. 21:1)
	* How many prayers of Nehemiah are recorded in this book?
2.	This man exalted the Lord in praise as the "awesome (Heb. yare) God (Yahweh)" who kept all of His (v. 5)
3.	Nehemiah did <u>not</u> pray " and " for himself, but for his people; although he did include himself in this of sins. (v. 6, cf. Dan. 9:4-6; Ezra 9:6-15)
	* Is this how your prayers often begin?
4.	Even though Jehovah promised blessings and, thankfully He also promised if His people would turn back to Him. (Deut. 30; 1 Kings 8:31-53; 2 Chron. 7:14)

	* Did Nehemiah presumptuously think that he was worthy to have his prayer answered? (v. 7)
	* Is it significant to "remember" what the Lord has already declared in His Word? (v. 8a)
5.	Jehovah had promised that "" the people to Him, He would faithfully them back to the Promised Land. (vv. 8b-9; Deut. 30:1-5; 2 Chron. 6:6)
6.	In v. 10 Nehemiah "" the Lord that the Jews were His people, and he did so by quoting the words that Moses used while on behalf on Mt. Sinai. (v. 10, cf. Deut. 9:25-29)
	Phemiah Cared Enough to Volunteer (1:11)  Nehemiah came empty-handed, but not uninvited; he was sure that there were other Jews who were also and they would to the cause once they heard that God was at work. (v. 11a)
2.	It is clear that he had already determined that he was to if God chose to use him, but he needed the Sovereign King to move the of the earthly king. (v. 11b, cf. Dan. 2:21; 4:17)
