	2.	Four different groups of Jewish people were involved in this crisis	
		a. The first group were people who own but who desperately needed food, they had nothing to barter with. (v. 2)	
		b. The second group was composed of who had mortgaged their (lands, vineyards, houses) in order to buy food. (v. 3)	
		c. The third group complained because the from King Artaxerxes were too high but when they tried to mortgage their property, their Jewish brethren charged exorbitant (v. 4)	
		d. The fourth group of people actually had their taken from them into in order to pay the creditors. (v. 5, cf. Deut. 15:12-18)

B.	The Governor's Solution (5:6-13)			
	1.	Nehemiah was busy overseeing the wall, keeping the enemy out, and his first response to all of this internal and extortion among fellow Jews was (v. 6)

	3.	Apparently while in Babylon Nehemiah and some fellow Jews to certain Gentiles to liberate Jewish slaves so they could to return to Judah; how it was for the Jews in Jerusalem to them once again. (v. 8)		
	4.	For Nehemiah, the Jews' among the unbelieving Gentile was no small matter; he despised any reproach. (v. 9)		
	5.	The governor that these social injustices needed to stop immediately, and that these people needed to their Jewish kinsmen the interest and security. (vv. 10-11)
