# THE SERVANT, THE SAVIOR, AND THE SAINTS

(Romans 1:1-7)

## I. THE SALUTATION AND INTRODUCTION TO THE BOOK OF ROMANS (1:1-7)

#### A. Paul the Writer (v. 1)

- 1. This salutation is the longest of Paul's letters, and he identifies himself as a \_\_\_\_\_\_\_\_\_ (Gk *doulos*) of Jesus Christ. (v. 1)
- Writing to believers he had never met, he laid out his credentials, he was an \_\_\_\_\_\_\_ of the Lord Jesus, which meant he had delegated \_\_\_\_\_\_\_ with a mission. (Acts 9:15; Gal. 1:1, 16; 2:7-9)

## **B.** Key Elements Regarding the Gospel and Jesus Christ (vv. 2-5)

### C. Glorious Benefits Received through Jesus Christ (vv. 5-6)
