	1.	In this section (and sporadically throughout the letter) the Apostle Paul utilizes a device called a "diatribe"; where he systematically shoots down the of an imaginary	
	2.	Paul addressed those people who considered themselves	
	3.	While the moral pagan or Jew would applaud Paul's condemnation of immoral people (1:18-32), they would not be willing to look at as a "refined" sinner. (v. 1b)	
	4.	So often people are not or to live up to their <u>own standards</u> that they have for others, but this does not stop them from others while practicing the very same thing. (v. 1c)	

5.	While human judgment is often with prejudice and partial perception, God's judgment is always, impartial, and based on absolute (v. 2)
6.	Sinners will judge other sinners, but divine judgment from God is coming for both, it is (v. 3)
7.	The Lord has given ample opportunity, He has poured out and, and He has been incredibly tolerant and in light of His holy character. (v. 4a)
8.	Much like the Jew, greater blessings and makes one even more responsible and to the truth. (v. 4b)
