## "BIBLICALLY, WHEN CAN YOU DISOBEY YOUR GOVERNMENT?" (Part 4)

## VII. GOD'S RIGHTEOUSNESS REVEALED THRU THE CHURCH (12:1-16:23)

## A. The Christian's Responsibility to Obey Governing Authorities (13:1-7)

- 1. Civil governments have been invested by God with the \_\_\_\_\_\_ to rule the state, and as Christians, we are to \_\_\_\_\_. (Rom. 13:1-7; 1 Peter 2:11-17)
