	b.	Having evangelized his current location, he expressed his for wanting to see the believers in Rome for; he was hoping it would now become a reality. (v. 23)	
	c.	Paul had a long-range goal to go to on the western edge of the Roman Empire to evangelize, but he also wanted to stop and all the believers in Rome. (v. 24a)	
	d.	He had hoped he could be financially by them, and at the same time enjoy wonderful (v. 24b, cf. 2 Cor. 1:16; Titus 3:13; 3 John 1:6)

	c.	The apostle also prayed that he would be able to come to the church in Rome with much, and that it would be in accordance with God's will; in addition, he wanted a profitable time of being with them. (v. 32)			
	d.	In closing his prayer, he hoped that God's amazing would be with them all. (v. 33)
