	a.	At first glance this might seem like a selfish prayer, but the purpose clause gives us the underling rationale, "Glorify Your Son, that [hina] your Son may glorify"
	b.	With the words, "the hour has come," it seems best to understand the "glory" to refer to the that was won there by our magnificent, triumphant Savior. (17:1)
2.	Je	sus prayed for His DISCIPLES (John 17:6-19)
	a.	Christ's tender for His disciples is observed in His intercessory prayer; they were completely unaware that their lives were about to drastically in a matter of days.
	b.	On the eve of choosing His disciples, Jesus spent literally all night in prayer; these were the men that it could be said, "You them to Me, and they have kept Your word." (John 17:6; Luke 6:12-13)
	c.	Christ could not pray for "the world" to continue on in its worldliness, and of Him, but He could pray for His disciples. (17:9)

	d.	Jesus' earthly course was just about through, but this would not be the case for His little band that would have to continue on without His presence. (17:11			
	e.	Christ prayed to the Father that His disciples would have fulfilled in their lives. (17:13)			
	f.	Jesus identified two of our enemies: first the us because we believe, and secondly we need to be kept "from the evil one." (17:14-16)			
	g.	He petitioned that His disciples would be saved from the power of in their daily lives by the truth of the Word of God. (17:17-19)			
3.	Jesus prayed for His FUTURE CHURCH (John 17:20-26)				
	a.	The Groom petitioned for His future Bride that she would have in Him. (17:20-23)			
	b.	Twice He prayed that as a result of the Church's witness, "that the may that You sent Me." (17:21, 23)			
	c.	In verses 25 and 26 Jesus does ask His Father for anything, but He simply with Him about His relationship with His band of followers.
