## **B.** WHY is Sound Doctrine So IMPORTANT?

Benefits of expository preaching

- 1. Encourages correct interpretation by consistently dealing with the verses in their context.
- 2. Serves to maintain the ongoing and repeated emphases of Scripture.
- 3. Forces you to teach the whole counsel of God and not avoid certain subjects or difficult verses.
- 4. Prods your listeners to interact with the **Bible**, not your man-made sermon. (1 Tim. 4:12-16)
- 5. Allows naturally for the correct order of understanding to transpire, first focusing on the passage and then making **applications**.
- 6. Discourages the teacher from resorting to his hobby-horses and pet peeves.
- 7. Magnifies Scripture as the inerrant, verbally inspired Word of God.
- 8. Best achieves the **biblical intent** of preaching, allowing **God** to speak, not man. (Titus 2:15)
- 9. Limits accusations of "pulpit-whipping" or people-targeting.
- 10. Allows the listener to **re-read** the passage or book **with understanding**, not having to "recreate" the sermon.
- 11. Brings the preacher into direct and continual contact with the mind of the Spirit, **developing the pastor/teacher** as a man of God's Word.
- 12. Provides a storehouse of preaching material and helps the preacher save time in determining what to teach next time.

	Four Imbalances You Need to Avoid
(1)	Being content with the knowledge of doctrine (which only puffs up), instead of mixing truth with (which builds up). (1 Corinthians 8:1-2)
(2)	Being self-deceived through only the Word of God, but not it. (James 1:22)
(3)	Being satisfied with an understanding of God's, but not, God regarding them. (Hebrews 4:2)
(4)	Being doctrinally sound, but not and and in the Lord with real worship from the heart. (Psalm 19:14)
