	a. to authorities (1 Pet. 2:13-17), b. for slaves to submit to their (2:18-25), c. for wives to their husbands (3:1-7), d. and finally, for the congregation to submit to spiritual (5:1-4).
2.	The apostle called for the younger people of the church to have a proper of for the more spiritually mature believers in the assembly. (v. 5a)
3.	Peter admonished of his readers "to be submissive to one another"; i.e., all of them had a personal to serve each other in (v. 5b, cf. Eph. 5:19-21; Philip. 2:1-4)
4.	The apostle quoted from Proverbs 3:34 to prove his point, that of us can be submissive to each other until we are submissive to (v. 5c, cf. James 4:6)
