## "HOW WELL DO YOU WANT TO 'KNOW' CHRIST?"

(Philippians 3:10-14)

## I. PAUL'S BURNING DESIRE TO KNOW CHRIST (3:10-12)

A.	The Apostle gives us the very reason why he was willing to	everything,	"that I may
	<i>Him.</i> " (3:10a)		

- 1. The word "know" (ginosko) speaks of intimate, \_\_\_\_\_\_, experiential knowledge.
- 2. Because Paul possessed salvation, it was now his lifelong \_\_\_\_\_\_ and \_\_\_\_\_ to develop a relationship with Christ.
- B. In his desire to get to know Christ, Paul expressed that he wanted to know "*the* \_\_\_\_\_\_\_ (*dunamis*) of *His resurrection*" which tells us he was interested in the \_\_\_\_\_\_\_ of identification truth. (3:10b)

## **II.** PAUL'S SINGLE MINDEDNESS OF PRESSING TOWARDS THE GOAL (3:13-14)
